An Opportunity for Stability

Prosper and Chantal, originally from the Democratic Republic of the Congo, have been in the United States for nine years. Living in a high rent apartment with only three small bedrooms and no yard, Prosper wanted stability for his family. "I went on the website to learn the process of owning a home. We were very excited when we were approved."

The next step was working towards their 450 hours of "sweat equity". Motivated from the start, Prosper and Chantal were able to finish all of their "sweat equity" hours in less than three months.

Before moving into the Habitat house, Prosper and Chantal's four kids were frequently






