## **Feathering the Nest**

Wanting to be more sustainable, Liz hatched an idea to build a chicken coop in the backyard.

"I used what I learned on the construction site to build it," she explains, "even going as far as recycling some scraps that were going to be thrown out to make the roof for the coop."
