





## Financials

## Volunteers

Volunteers are vital to the success of PPHFH. We recruit individuals, groups, and community partners to give their time and talent to our construction site, the administrative office, and our ReStore. It takes nearly 3,000 hours to build a Habitat home; approximately 90% of each home is built by volunteers. In FY15, a total of 2,334 construction volunteers gave 17,260 hours; and 5,471 non-construction volunteers gave 28,010 hours.

The service of volunteers enables the cost of each home to be affordable for a deserving family. To those who have volunteered on a worksite last year, we thank you. This year, we honor the following volunteers:

#### **ReStore:**

In 2004, the Pikes Peak Habitat for Humanity ReStore, LLC. was established as a self-sustaining fundraising entity to benefit Pikes Peak Habitat for Humanity. It's a retail outlet for low-cost building materials and home improvement products in Colorado Springs. El Paso County residents benefit from access to these discounted building materials and furniture.



In FY15, the ReStore contributed \$485,000 to Pikes Peak Habitat – enough to build nearly four entire Habitat homes!

The vision of the ReStore is to convert charitable donations of building materials and furniture into cash for use by Pikes Peak Habitat for Humanity to construct simple, decent, affordable homes. We set a high standard for stewardship of God's resources in El Paso County by helping to divert and recycle thousands of tons of usable material from being deposited into local landfills.



In FY15, the ReStore diverted 1,190 tons of material from the landfill!
