Their family moved from Cuba in 2009. Jean is a custodian at Hunt Elementary; Natacha is a teacher's assistant at Fremont Elementary, both in Colorado Springs School District 11.

Our family said you can have the 'American Dream' but you will have to work hard to get it.

They also knew they could get a job here and have the opportunity to buy a house, but it wouldn't be easy. "Our family said you can have the 'American Dream' but you will have to work hard to get it. We came here prepared to work."

They did. And it paid off in March 2012 when they accepted the keys to their Habitat home.

"We have a house. Now we are working hard on it. What we save every month, we can build onto our house." Since moving in, they have added a patio cover, designed their front yard and painted the interior. Jean isn't done yet. Currently, he is in the process of building a garage!

In addition to their full-time employment, Jean also works

part-time as a meat cutter while Natacha is a student learning medical terminology to assist in the medical field. According to Natacha, "We want to be a model for our kids. If they complain, I tell them I go to school and have to get good grades. And I work, too. My husband

works two jobs and is adding on to the house. No excuses!"

Buying a Habitat home has perpetuated an already strong work ethic in other areas of their lives. They have not taken anything for granted. "My husband and I can have a career,

just like any American. Not just a 'Latino' job. I can go to school and work like any American woman. I'm not less of a person."

Jean volunteered for Pikes Peak Habitat before eventually applying for a home. They are both appreciative of the donors and volunteers who helped them get into their home. Natacha summed it up by saying, "Thank you, thank you, thank you times 20!"
