"God intervened," Karen Kleine said of her seven year journey to Habitat homeownership.

"Scott owned his own landscaping business. It was his calling."
Karen continued to share that her husband was a successful businessman before moving with their four children to Colorado Springs

from Portland, Oregon in September 2007.

A family friend suggested moving here, because the region had a lot to offer. Scott adds, "I found work with a landscaping company. But, because of the weather, there isn't any work from October on. And I was laid off." With no money coming in, and at the onset of the economic crash, they were forced to move out — and they became homeless.

Fortunately, the Kleines entered into a transitional housing program through Interfaith Hospitality Network. There local churches house families to help

them get their footing on life's necessities. One of those churches was First Lutheran. Scott made such an impression that he was hired as the church sexton.

Eventually the family moved into a duplex, hoping it would provide more stability. Zachary, the Kleine's youngest, said, "It was not so nice there." All four children shared one room. They couldn't

have a family meal at a kitchen table. Black mold rendered another bedroom unusable. The sewage constantly backed up. The crime was so bad where they lived that, according to Scott, "Even the SWAT Team paid the neighbors in our duplex a visit. Not once, but twice!"

As the church choir finished practice one evening, Scott prepared to lock the doors. One of the choir members,



Sandie Trowbridge, asked if he had considered Pikes Peak Habitat for Humanity. The family applied in 2008, but due to a "mountain of debt" they were denied. "God did some changing in our hearts," said Karen. After receiving their tax refund they determined to pay off their bills. "We wouldn't risk being homeless again," said Scott.

In 2012, they applied a second time. Again they were denied because there wasn't a house that could accommodate their family size. However, they were encouraged to apply again. Thanks to Bike & Build's sponsorship of a 5 bedroom house, the Kleines were accepted! "Bike & Build opened my eyes to my faith and blew me away," said Scott.

The Kleine family moved into their new home on June 1st. Over 80 friends attended their House Dedication! Now they are experiencing some "firsts". Finally able to eat at the dining table, Karen is looking forward to hosting family this Thanksgiving. Emily, 12, is looking forward to painting her room, "any color I want." Zachary, 8, and Tessa, 15, just celebrated their birthdays in their new home. Tessa had a friend over for her first-ever sleep-over. Michael, 14, is looking forward to attending Liberty High School and working with his dad on the house. Scott, looking to return to his horticulture roots said, "This summer, I can't wait to landscape our backyard with my son, Michael."




