Liberating. That's what Tim said it felt like when he moved into his Habitat home. For his wife, Samantha, and their two children, Teresa and Robert, it brought stability.

"When Samantha and I were children, it felt like we were tossed around like Samsonite luggage. We had no stable place to stay," Tim said. "As adults we determined to make things better." He worked hard at keeping the home they rented in good condition, to the point that the landlord said, "You keep this place in better shape than I do!" Seeing this initiative, the landlord encouraged them to apply for a Habitat home. They were accepted into the

program in 2009 and moved in a year later.

Several recent surgeries and debilitating events left Tim disabled, but that has not kept

him from working on his home. After moving in, they had a minimal amount of

put many would-be green-thumbs to shame. "Not only is it a sense of accomplishment, it improves the quality of

my mental being," said Tim. "We bought

this house. We don't treat it like a rental."

"It doesn't take a million dollars to make things better. You use what you have," Tim explained over his gardening bench. "I

make a point of investing at least one hour a day on my yard. That's seven hours a week. We are custodians of this house and the land. Just because we're [on limited income] doesn't mean we have to compromise our integrity."

Tim and Samantha said Pikes Peak Habitat, its donors and

volunteers, paid it forward to help them. "We want to do the same." By staying in touch with Habitat, they find out which house is ready for

landscaping and donate several plants from their

own garden.

As parents of two high school seniors (one with autism) Tim and Samantha cherish having a

home that can meet the changing needs of their family. They are planning to convert their garage into a family room with a bay window to display their plants and flowers.

Tim said, "I am proud of our Habitat home. It's liberating for my family to have a stable place to live."
