# Cyclists Pedal for Habitat

Imagine spending the summer cycling across the United States -- and building houses! Students and young adults from across the country are doing just that with Bike & Build. This unique program organizes cycling trips for young adults,

raising funds and awareness for affordable housing across America. Two cycling teams came through Colorado Springs this summer to help Pikes Peak Habitat work on houses in our Woodmen Vistas development.

The first team began in Chapel Hill, North Carolina and is on their way to San Diego, California, a trip of 70 days and 3,565 miles! On their stop in Colorado Springs June 24-27, they worked on the foundation for one home. The second team started in Charleston, South Carolina and will finish in Santa Cruz, California for a trip of 81 days and 4,150 miles. Arriving on July 3<sup>rd</sup> and leaving on July 11<sup>th</sup>, their challenge here was to complete a Habitat house in a week!

On July 5<sup>th</sup> everyone joined in celebration with a ground blessing for the home built by the second team for the Backman family. Afterwards the Pikes Peak Habitat Board of Directors hosted a "thank you" potluck dinner for the cyclists.
