the issue: housing affordability

Families all across the United States are paying too high a price to cover the cost of their home. Rents and homeownership costs are skyrocketing, while wages are not keeping pace. Far too often, families struggle to make ends meet. Everywhere you look—cities, suburbs, rural areas—the stability that home should bring remains out of reach for too many families. At Habitat, we know that a family should never have to spend more than 30 percent of their income on a home. But consider that today over **19 million U.S. households pay half or more of their income on a place to live.**

That is unacceptable.

That means that 1 in 6 families are denied the personal and economic stability that safe, decent and affordable housing provides. Instead, 1 in 6 families are forced to make impossible choices. Safe homes. Nutritious food on the table. Health care. Access to good schools. Reliable transportation. Which would you choose?

Habitat knows the complexities that surround the cost of home. We also know the struggle, stress and pain of far too many families in our communities. And we know that those with the fewest resources are forced to make the hardest choices. We have to take a stand and declare our commitment: No family should have to pay more than half of their paycheck to cover the cost of home. Everyone deserves to build the foundation for a strong, healthy future for themselves and their families — no matter where they live or how much money they earn.

the solution: a national advocacy campaign

Building on our strong record of advocacy achievements throughout the U.S. and on the unparalleled reputation of Habitat's network of over 1,200 U.S. affiliates, Habitat will engage housing advocates; Habitat homeowners, volunteers and supporters; and federal, state and local policymakers to advance access to safe, decent and affordable homes through our first U.S. advocacy campaign.

Habitat affiliates across the country are committed to mobilizing—our partners, our volunteers and community members— to find the solutions and help create the policies that will allow 10 million individuals to meet their most basic needs.

PPHFH will host a Legislative Build Day June 27, 2019, inviting our local government to get dirty while building critical change. Visit our website for more information.

Women Build Building Hope. Community. Tomorrow.



Originating in 1991 with a Charlotte, North Carolina home built entirely by a crew of female volunteers, Habitat's Women Build program encourages women to make a difference by building homes and communities. Women Build projects provide an environment in which women can feel comfortable learning construction skills they might not otherwise have the opportunity to learn. Globally, more than 1,400 homes have been completed by Women Build volunteers.

Women all over the United States have participated in National Women Build Week from previous years. The weeklong build leading up to Mother's Day has traditionally been designed to showcase the skills of Women Build volunteers and to motivate new volunteers to help families and change communities.

May 9—11, 2019 saw the launch of our 2019 Women Build projects. New for 2019, Pikes Peak Habitat expanded this iconic program, growing from one annual build to four – one build quarterly in March, May, August, and November.

The May build saw dozens of volunteers from throughout our El Paso County community, representing organizations such as Women's Council of Realtors, Lowe's Home Improvement, Envision Radiology, and Harris Corporation, men and women from all backgrounds, faiths, and skill levels coming together to swing hammers and get their hands dirty at both our Country Living community in Fountain and at Dale Street, our newest community in Colorado Springs.
