Seeking to put God's love into action, Pikes Peak Habitat for Humanity brings people together to build homes, communities and hope.

Does Habitat give away free homes? The short answer: no. We believe that by *empowering* people, we can make a true and lasting impact in their lives. For this reason, we pride ourselves in providing a hand-up rather than a hand-out. Everyone who receives a Habitat home does so as a *homeowner* and pays an affordable monthly *mortgage*. Not only that, but every Habitat homeowner is required to put in 200 hours of 'sweat equity'. This includes 200 hours volunteering to build their own home, their neighbor's home, and more.

Is Habitat a secular organization? We are proud to be a faith-based non-profit. Habitat has deep Christian roots and continues to operate as an ecumenical Christian organization. We are motivated by God's love, and just as Jesus demonstrated, we serve *all people* – regardless of race or religion. Likewise, we always welcome the opportunity to partner with people and organizations of all cultural and religious backgrounds.

Do volunteers need to have prior construction experience? Volunteer groups come from a variety of different backgrounds and many do not have any construction experience. Our staff works closely with volunteers, teaching them the skills they need to accomplish the day's tasks. Ninety percent of a Habitat home is built by volunteers; we absolutely could not do it without you!

I am unable to help at the build site. Are there other ways to volunteer? Yes! First and foremost, we can always use a little prayer. Additionally, you can invite us to give a presentation at your place of worship, you can provide lunch for build-site volunteers, you can prepare a welcome basket for our new homeowners, you can help organize a fundraiser, and much more...the sky's the limit!

Is there really a housing crisis in El Paso County? One in seven households in Colorado spend more than half their income on housing. This is not surprising given how quickly rents and home costs are rising here in El Paso County and around the state. In our very own neighborhoods it is not hard to find families who are doing everything the right way, are working hard, and yet are still struggling to make ends meet.

Affordable housing has a major impact on a child's education.

Families who spend too much of their income on housing often must make critical trade-offs, including forgoing educational and enrichment opportunities for themselves and their children.

For children, frequent or unplanned moves will often negatively impact achievement. A stable place to call home provides a secure environment and adequate space to study and think. Better lighting, room for a small desk, a parent's ability to devote time to helping with homework — all of these can lead to improved academic outcomes.*
