Opening

Rabbi Pillsbury opened the meeting at 12:05pm with prayer.

Guest Introductions

Committee members and staff members were introduced.

PPHFH Programs Overview

Mr. Alarid provided a brief overview of PPHFH programs in order to ensure everybody shares the same context and understanding:

- PPHFH Established in 1986, non-profit, affordable housing program
 - Avg. 8 homes per year
- Faith-based, ecumenical Christian organization
 - o "Unapologetically Christian, radically inclusive"
 - o Serve and partner with people of all backgrounds/faiths
 - Strict no proselytizing policy
- Homeowners pay affordable mortgage and must have (1) Ability (2) Willingness (3) Need
- 90% of a home is built by volunteers
 - No experience needed, minimum age of 16 yrs
 - o Groups usually 10 people or less, Thursday-Saturday 8:30-4:30pm
- Majority of funding comes from individual donors, corporate donors, grants, Gift in Kind, and Fund for Humanity (mortgages, ReStore proceeds)
- 2020 Avg. Habitat Home Cost is ~\$160,000 including land

Faith in Action Program Overview

- Officially established in July 2019
- Made possible by Federal Capacity Building Grant
- 3yr grant to fund salary of employee; must fulfill Strategic Plan: including facilitation/growth of the Thrivent Faith Build, Global Village (Intl. Development), Interfaith Build, and more
- Being Federally Funded, FIA Manager cannot solicit donations/fundraise

- Thrivent Faith Build
 - o 14th year of partnership with Thrivent Financial
 - o Thrivent donates 50% cost of home/remaining 50% to come from local churches
 - Volunteer groups from local Christian churches (all denominations)
 - Lutherans, Catholics, Methodists, and other Mainline Protestants have been consistent partners
- International Development
 - 10% of all undesignated funds 'tithed' to Habitat programs in developing countries
 - Habitat Nepal
 - Côte d'Ivoir Habitat
 - Orphans and Vulnerable Children's Fund
 - o Global Village Trips volunteering opportunities abroad on Habitat projects
 - October 2020: Paraguay Trip, led by Eric Stolp
 - October 2020: Nepal Trip, led by Dustin Alarid

Introduction to the Interfaith Build for Unity

- Goal of bringing unity into the community through a Habitat Home Build
 - o Especially important during this divisive election year
 - Meaningful for participants, but also symbolic to entire community
- Bookended by Ground Blessing (August?) and Home Dedication (Spring 2021?)
 - Prayer and speeches by Interfaith leaders, Habitat Staff and BOD
 - Introduction of Homeowners
 - Symbolic Tradition includes ground breaking and ribbon cutting
 - Special performances? (Spoken Word Poetry? Choir? Dove release?)
- Bi-weekly volunteer days?
 - o Possibly: 2 different groups, 5 from each, volunteering together
 - Work day options: Thursday- Saturday (Sunday option?) (Regulars fill in gaps)
 - 8:30 to 4:30 (with half day option if necessary)
 - Sign-ups facilitated by our online volunteer program
 - o Group lunches, cultural dishes, good way to build relationships on site
- Funding
 - Pilot year funding will come from Fund for Humanity (ReStore/Mortgages)
 - Supplemental funds welcome and encouraged (but not deal breaker)
 - Goal is self-sustainability for future builds (donations by faith groups, individual donors, grants, foundations, etc.)
- Kick-Off Event(s)?

What's needed from the Committee? (To be continued in future meetings)

- Brainstorming, dreaming, and planning
- Advocacy
- Event Planning (Kick-off event? Ground Blessing and Home Dedication)
- Volunteer Recruitment and Outreach to New Partners
 - Examples:
 - African-American Churches (AME, Missionary Baptist, etc.)
 - Asian-American Churches (Chinese, Korean, Vietnamese, etc.)

- Atheist/Agnostic/Humanist Organizations
- Buddhist Communities (Thai, Tibetan, Zen, etc.)
- Chaplains (Army, Air Force, Colorado College, Fire, Police, UCCS, etc.)
- Congregationalist / United Church of Christ
- Eastern Orthodox (Holy Theophany)
- GuruGhar (Sikh)

- Islamic Society of Colorado Springs

Brainstorming Session

- Mr. Ader recommended that there be an electronic promotional document or marketing materials to present to faith organizations.
- Rabbi Pillsbury suggested that there be an element of cross-cultural/interfaith learning and dialogue incorporated into the programs.
 - o Mr. Alarid suggested that build-site lunch breaks may be a good venue for this.
- Mr. Stolp believes that groups may be interested in "sponsorships" not just for money
 or marketing purposes, but to be promoted as a group that promotes the cause of unity
 within the community.

 - o It was suggested that the venue change month-to-month.
