Pikes Peak Habitat for Humanity Celebrates 35 Years

Colorado Springs, CO (October 28, 2021) – Pikes Peak Habitat for Humanity (PPHFH) hosted an anniversary celebration at The Pinery in Colorado Springs in recognition of 35 years of building and advocating for affordable housing in El Paso County.

The evening was sponsored by GE Johnson with Corporate Citizenship Manager Stella Hodgkins on hand to open the evening's presentation and welcome guests. Also included in the evening's activities were a 35-year history of PPHFH by Executive Director and CEO Kris Lewis; PPHFH facts and trivia highlighted by Director of Strategic Partnerships Iain Probert; and the shared personal journey of future Habitat homeowner and single mother Brittany who, having experienced homelessness, will complete her Habitat home in December of this year for her family. In attendance were local officials, donors, and volunteers.

Note of interest: Habitat Nepal and Habitat Cote d'Ivoire are recipients of PPHFH tithe donations that come from 10% of undesignated donations to PPHFH, including ReStore net income. Tithe donations also currently help Orphans and Vulnerable Groups, and the Disaster Response Fund. In March 2021 HFHI awarded PPHFH the Sam Mompongo Award for tithing over \$1,000,000 (over the lifetime of PPHFH) to Habitat's worldwide efforts to sustain families by building safe and affordable housing.
