Habitat selects applicants based on three main criteria:

Need for Housing Applicants must demonstrate that their current housing situation is unsafe, overcrowded, unhealthy, or unaffordable. Applicants who successfully demonstrate all three criteria will ultimately be selected based on level of need.

Willingness to Partner Before moving into their home, Habitat homebuyers must complete 200 hours of sweat equity, attend mandatory homebuyer classes, and participate in ongoing financial review.

Ability to Pay Habitat homebuyers must be able to repay a Habitat mortgage and must be able to show two years of income stability. The household's gross income must fall between the minimum and maximum income requirements. Income may include job wages, child support, alimony, survivors benefits, SSDI, and SSI. Habitat will conduct a credit check to look for debts, collections, open judgments, or recent bankruptcies.

Non-Proselytizing Policy

Habitat for Humanity International (Habitat) and its affiliated organizations will not proselytize. Nor will Habitat work with entities or individuals who insist on proselytizing as part of their work with Habitat. This means that Habitat will not offer assistance on the expressed or implied condition that people must adhere to or convert to a particular faith or listen and respond to messaging designed to induce conversion to a particular faith.
