Habitat for Humanity, Thrivent, and local churches come together in celebration of one Colorado Springs family's dream of homeownership

COLORADO SPRINGS, CO. (Jan. 22, 2022) – Pikes Peak Habitat for Humanity, Thrivent, and local Christian churches dedicated a home on January 22, 2022 as part of the ongoing partnership between Habitat and Thrivent, which helps families in the U.S. and across the globe obtain strength, stability and self-reliance through shelter.

Through the partnership of Habitat and Thrivent, local churches, and other volunteers, Brittany is realizing the dream of owning her own home.

"It's amazing to know that there are programs out here that help people achieve this next step of the American dream," said Brittany. "It's hard for anyone to do it, and to do it alone is even harder. I've felt really alone a lot, but then I realized that I wasn't really alone and that there is help out there; you just have to find it, and you have to be willing to put in the work to find it, then you can [achieve homeownership]".

To date, 15 homes have been built or rehabbed in El Paso County through the partnership between Habitat and Thrivent.

"It's always a rewarding experience when we get to work alongside volunteers who donate their time, talents and treasures to strengthen our community."
