Volunteers are a vital resource for PPHFH with 90% of each PPHFH house built by volunteers under construction staff supervision. At the ReStore, volunteers allow us to run a strong business and still have net proceeds to support affordable housing. In 2021, a total of 2,164 volunteers gave 41,704 hours in construction of houses, service on the board of directors and/or committees, administrative assistance, and retail help in the ReStores.
