Pikes Peak Habitat for Humanity Honors Love In Action for Land Donation to Habitat Community

Five families have already moved in – 25 more homes to be built

Colorado Springs, CO (June 17, 2022) - Pikes Peak Habitat for Humanity (PPHFH) celebrated its community, The Ridge at Sand Creek, and recognized LeRoy Landhuis and Love In Action for making it possible by the donation of 30 lots to build Habitat homes.

A specially engraved granite bench was unveiled in honor of Love In Action and is installed in the Sand Creek community within the PPHFH neighborhood. Ryan Panariso, Community Bank President of ANB Bank and president of the PPHFH Board of Directors, provided a blessing over the bench.

Reflecting on the land donation to PPHFH, LeRoy Landhuis, president of Love In Action, said, "I hope this is a blessing for our community, for the people who live here."

Kris Lewis, PPHFH Executive Director/CEO, spoke about partnering with Love In Action to build attainable workforce housing, and the need for more housing. "We're here to build a neighborhood, we're here to create a very strong community, and we're doing that. It's because of so many of you in this room that advocate and understand that affordable housing is quality housing."
