For day four, Pikes Peak Habitat invites you to learn about one tangible way that you can support interfaith efforts in our community through Pikes Peak Habitat's Interfaith Build for Unity (IBU).



1 OVERVIEW

This project brings together volunteers from different backgrounds, beliefs, spiritual practices, and faith traditions to work together in unity to help build affordable homes in El Paso County for families. We unite around the convictions that everyone deserves a decent, safe place to call home, and all faiths and beliefs can be put into action.

2 HOW IT WORKS

Congregations and communities from a variety of faiths volunteer, side-by-side, to build affordable homes for local families. Our IBU volunteer days are a celebration of tolerance, cooperation, and love for fellow human beings. Here's how it works:

- 1) Invite five members of your community to volunteer (no experience necessary). 16 years and older.
- 2) Your group is paired with a team of local volunteers from a different tradition. The two groups work together on the construction site, talk together over lunch, and stand unified as friends and equals.
