**6** families, including **12** children, closed on their homes  
(5 new homes; 1 recycled home, in which a home built by  
Pikes Peak Habitat was returned to us and renovated)  
**77** home repairs supported health, safety, and accessibility  
**9** families plan to close on their homes in FY '25

**43** repairs were completed in partnership with the  
Johns Hopkins University School of Nursing  
Community Aging in Place, Advancing Better  
Living for Elders (CAPABLE) program

**1,665** volunteers worked more than **23,000** hours on the construction site,  
equaling **12** full-time employees

**19** volunteers worked **3,870** hours with the home repair program,  
equaling **2** full-time employees

**417** volunteers worked **8,084** hours at the ReStore Northeast,  
equaling **4** full-time employees

**999** volunteers worked **16,855** hours at the ReStore South,  
equaling **8** full-time employees

Pikes Peak Habitat representatives  
met with legislators at  
**Habitat on the Hill** (Washington, D.C.)  
and **Coffee at the Capitol** (Denver)  
to advocate for policies that support  
affordable homeownership in Colorado  
and throughout the United States



**A survey of Pikes Peak Habitat homeowners found that...**

**88%** felt more stable in their living situation

**82%** reported better financial security

**77%** felt better about their children's futures

**66%** felt that they spend more time as a family

**64%** felt less stressed

**58%** felt better about their job prospects
