Jordan

Importance of tithe

One hundred percent of affiliate tithe is transferred to Habitat national organizations to support the mission of serving families in need of shelter. This tithe revenue is generally unrestricted once it arrives in the country, giving national organizations the flexibility to use the funds as needed. Tithe donations are often the most significant — and sometimes the only — source of unrestricted funding for national organizations because most other donors fund specific projects. As U.S. affiliates know, unrestricted funding is difficult to raise but critical for supporting day-to-day operations.

Tithes from U.S. affiliates also often provide the seed funding for pilot projects that have transformational impacts on families and communities — innovative projects that have few or no other sources of initial financial support. And tithe is often used to match funds for grants and to build the staff capacity of the organization.

Current projects in the pipeline

Below are examples of the work that could be done by Habitat Jordan with your increased support.

Responding to impacts of Syrian refugee crisis

Since 2018, Habitat Jordan has been supporting the protracted refugee crisis through its Middle East Refugee Crisis Initiative with improved access to safe, secure, and dignified housing and essential services for vulnerable families. To strengthen broader social cohesion, this project entails a dual



focus on both rehabilitating substandard homes and identifying and rehabilitating essential community infrastructure, such as community water and sanitation systems, schools, medical centers, public parks and care centers. Through this work, Habitat Jordan has rehabbed more than 780 homes for vulnerable Jordanians and Syrian refugees and completed 52 communal projects. We aim to support another 124 households and eight community projects this year. An additional \$355,000 is needed for this project.

Supporting Palestinian camps in Jordan

Habitat Jordan is working to re-establish shelter and basic service interventions for vulnerable Palestinians in Jordan, focusing on refugee camps at the household and community levels. The aim is to support another 80 households and one communal project with energy efficiency interventions this coming year. An additional \$328,000 is needed for this project.

Green affordable housing

Habitat Jordan focuses on green building priorities, which include implementing residential energy efficient solutions and providing training in green building techniques, materials, and designs. Through this urban project, 42 green homes have been completed with another six currently underway. An additional \$150,000 is needed for this project.
